

The Role of the Volunteer

Is to enable you and your family to feel supported.

Volunteers enjoy contact with young families and understand the importance of nurturing parents so that they can nurture their children.

Volunteers have parenting experience and have undergone a training program through Connect Child and Family Services.

Volunteers are there to be useful to you. Their role is not to act as counsellors or to give medical advice.
